

INSTRUCTIONS FOR AUTHORS

The Croatian Review for Rehabilitation Research, which is the successor to the Journal of Defectology, publishes papers in the following fields: visual impairment, hearing impairments, speech pathology, physical impairments and chronic diseases, intellectual disabilities and behavioral disorders including delinquent behavior, which deals with problems of etiology of impairments and disorders, diagnosis, prevention, and also with problems of education, training, treatment and social integration of children, young people, and adults with these impairments and disorders. Although priority is given to papers based on the results of empirical research, other contributions, such as theoretical and professional articles, scientific and professional commentaries, and book reviews are welcome.

All contribution should be in Croatian or in English and typewritten, double-spaced, on A4 or letter-sized paper. Tables and illustration should be numbered with Arabic numerals and enclosed separately, but their approximate place should be marked in the text. Contributions should not be longer than 25 pages. The page number should appear on each page, and footnotes should be avoided. Quotations should be identified by citing the surname of the quoted author and the year of publication with brackets, for example: Nunnally (1967) or (Nunnally, 1967). When the cited work has more than three authors, only the surname of the first is given, followed by abbreviation et al., for example: Harris et al. (1969). At the end of the contribution there should be a bibliography arranged in alphabetical order. If the contribution is the result of team effort, all of the authors should be mentioned. Responsibility in the term of the accuracy of the given references remains the sole responsibility of the author(s).

Bibliographical entries should be listed in the following way:

1. Book:

3. Conference Paper:

4. Journal Article:

5. Thesis:

The first page should contain the title, the author(s), the institution and the full address of the author (for further correspondence). If there are more than one author, one of them should be designated as a correspondent. The shortened title of the paper should be stated as well. The second page should contain the title of the contribution and its abstract. It is advisable that the abstract contains from 150-300 words as well as 3-6 key words.

In general, papers presenting results of empirical research should consist of the following parts: Introduction, Method, Results and Discussion, Conclusion. The aim and the hypothesis should be given at the end of the introductory part. Copies of the paper in print should be sent to the editor with electronic version (in MS Word or pdf format) on CD or by e-mail revija@erf.hr.

The procedure of reviewing is double anonymous. The Editorial Board has the right to adapt paper to the general editing standards of the journal. Galley proofs are sent to the author designated as the correspondent for correction. The corrected proofs should be returned to the editor within the week. Manuscripts are not returned to authors.
